WAR DEPARTMENT, September 25, 1861.

w His Eccellency A. G. CURTIN, Governor of Pennsylvonia, Harrisburg.

Bin:—I have the honor to transmit the following order from the War Department:

1. All men now enrolled or mustered into the service of the United States for brigades, regiments, batteries or companies in the State of Pennsylvania, who shall organize or reorganize them as he may deem most advantageous to the interests of the General Government.

2. The United States will continue to furnish subsistence, camp equipage, clothing, &c., as heretofore, fore, for the organizations referred to in the first paragraph, and all U. S. commissances and quartermasters will furnish, on requisitions made, the necessary subsistence, clothing, &c.,

3.
