Preparations for a Sceret Expedition.
FORTRESS MONROE, Nov. 22.—Several egiments have arrived from Baltimore and Annapolis during the last twenty four hours, and Old Point has assumed an unusually bustling appearance. Formidable preparations are being made for active operations, the theatre of which has not been disclosed. The ferry boats in the Roads are being heavily armed. General Butler came on from Washington this morning, and he spent the day at Old Point, on the Rip Raps, and at Newport News. Ho will proceed to Baltimore to night.

From Missouri, Rolla, Mo., November 23 - McCulloch, with a large force, is now encamped between Springfield and Lebanon. His pickets extended last night over a space of 15 miles this side of Lebanon. This is reliable. It was rumored in camp last night that the advance of the rebel army, 8000 strong, was at the Gasconade about 13 miles west of here. This, however, is not credited.

Steamer Keystone State Supposed to be Lost. DETROIT, Nov. 22.—The steamer Keys LATE STYLES OF FALL GOOD stone State, hence for Milwaukie, on the 8th inst., is believed to have gone down with all on board. She was last seen in a gale, apparently disabled, and pieces of wreck, supposed to belong to her, have since been picked up on Lake Uron.
