Y, offered resolution, which was adopted, request ing the Attorney General to report his views us to the means of obtaining retroession of that portion of Virginia former ly belonging to the District of Columbia.

Mr. Potter, of Wis, from the Commits
tee on Public Lands, reported a bill providing homesteads for actual settlers, and providing a bounty for soldiers in lieu of grants of public lands. He explained that the homestead feature of this bill was

e entited to the provisions of this act. It deo contains a section giving a bounty of \$30 to the three months' volunteers. The tuture consideration of the bill was postponed till Wednesday next.

The House concurred in the reselution from the Senate for a joint committee to squire into the conduct of the present war,

with the power to send for persons and SENATE. - Messrs. Fessenden and Sumner, presented petitions for the emancipa-tion of the blacks under the war power. Mr. Sumper, of Mass. presented the petition of Francis A. Treadway, setting forth that he had some time ago presented a complaint to the Supreme Court against Jeff. Davis and others, but was told that they were improper papers. Heafterwards presented the complaint to a Magistrate's Court, but to no effect. The matter' was referred to the Committee on the Judis
