that committee. On motion, fifteen hundred extra copies of the Secretary of the Tressury's repor ere ordered to be printed. Mr. Bingham, of Ohio, introduced a bill o confiscate the property and slaves of persons who are in armed rebellion against e United States; also, a joint resolution directing the present court at Alexandria to retain and keep safely the property of the-e engaged in or aiding rebellion, unfurther action by Congress is had upon the

subject. Both measures were referred to the Committee on the Juniciary. On motion of Mr. Haiman, of Indiana, t was resolved that the Committee on Public Lands be instructed to report what railroad companies have received donations of lands on condition of transporting roops and munitions of war from of charge and whether the Government has the ur qualified right of such transportation. Mr. Lovejoy, of lilinois, offered a reco-lution instructing the Committee on For-

eign Affairs to report a bil establishing diplomatic relations between the United States and Hayti and Liberia. Mr Vallandigham, of Onio, remarked that we want no negro ambassador.

A debate arising, the resolution lies over for future consideration. Mr. Blair, of Mo, offered a resolution declaring it but just to recognize the emi-nent and patriotic services of the late Gen. Lyon, and tendering the thanks of Congress to the brave officers and soldiers under his command, who sustained the honor of the flag and ach eved a victory at Springfield.
