**CONGRESSMAN ELY RELEASED**  
**Account of his Capture and Captivity.**

Hon. Alfred Ely arrived at Washington on Friday from Baltimore. He makes a very interesting account of his own capture and captivity in the rebel lines. He gives the following account of his capture:  
I was captured by the rebels on the morning of the 12th of July, 1862, at the battle of Bull Run. I was taken to a prison in the rebel lines, and there I remained for several weeks. I was treated with great kindness, and I was allowed to write to my family. I was also allowed to see the rebels, and I was very much interested in them. I was released on the 15th of August, 1862, and returned to Washington on the 17th of the same month.
