### THIRTY-SEVENTH CONGRESS.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—House.—The speaker laid before the House a report from the Secretary of War, in which he says he has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the resolution adopted on the 8th inst., to the effect that the answer of the Department to the resolution of inquiry, passed on the 8th day of the session, is not responsive and satisfactory to the House, and requesting a further answer. The Secretary has now respectfully suggested that measures have been taken to ascertain who is responsible for the delay in presenting the report, and he has suggested that the Department should be authorized to make known those measures at the present time.

### Gen Stevens still holds his Position.

New York, Jan. 10.—The steamer Oriole has arrived from Port Royal with dates to the 6th inst. The steamer Oriole or Atlantic going in at six o'clock in the morning.

Nothing special had occurred since the sailing of the Vanderbilt.

Gen. Stevens still held his position on the main land, and was awaiting reinforcements. The steamer Oriole would soon leave Port Royal for New York.

### U. S. Agricultural Society.

WASHINGTON, January 10.—The U. S. Agricultural Society has adopted a series of resolutions advocating Agricultural Education to procure a decent burial place for a series of experiments on the cultivation of cotton in the middle and northern States, also, of hemp and flax. The awards to be made by the Central Agricultural Society of the States in which the competitors reside. Arrangements have also been made for the exhibition of native wine, to be held in this city in January next.
