**CITY MATTERS.**  
**DROWNINGS.**—An unknown man, supposed to be the influence of liquor, fell from the railing of the Hand street bridge, on which he was sitting, yesterday morning, and was drowned before assistance reached him, though he rose to the surface twice or three times.  
On Monday night, an old man named Sims and his son were crossing the Ohio river at Detroit in a heavily laden wooden boat, when their craft capsized and both being thrown out, the old man was drowned, while the son was saved by clinging to the boat until assistance came from the shore. The deceased was a brother-in-law of the Pittsburgh, Fort Wayne and Chicago Railroad, and was about 25 years of age and leaves a wife and two children. The body was not recovered.

**APPEALS IN WESTERN VIRGINIA.**—The latest accounts from Western Virginia show that Jackson's army is about to check the advance of the Federal forces at Cheat Mountain in the rear. General Rosecrans is concentrating a large force, equal to Jackson's, to repulse the Federal advance in the rear. The latter is expected to have without delay effected a junction with General Lee, with ten thousand men, in his rear, and Colonel Mitrovich, with five well disciplined regiments, to the front. When these forces meet at Cheat Mountain, a most interesting battle will be the result.  
**RAILROAD ACCIDENT.**—The passenger car, speared, running on the Tyrone Railroad, jumped the track, and was derailed at 10 o'clock on Friday afternoon last. Several passengers were severely injured, among them the rear John A. Stewart and John Miller of Hollidaysburg. The former was cut on the head, and the latter received several bruises about the neck and arm. Another passenger suffered a very severe contusion of the knee. It was a miracle that none of them was killed.

**THE CITY OF NEW YORK SAFE.**  
New York, January 29.—The steamship City of New York, from Liverpool, arrived at New York, and the passengers were received by Captain Rice and his staff on Friday night. This is the first safe voyage since the late disaster at Havana, and the vessel was only five hundred tons burden, and was originally built for the Boston and Baltimore coastwise line.
