It is reported that a fleet of gunboats is now moving up the Tennessee river in order to attack the enemy, and that the passage of the gunboats is protected by a flank movement of infantry on the shore.

I was, in fact, a man, grateful for the preservation of his life, might be supposed to do.

A few days later, when the long extinct Hecla was again convulsing the island, and sending forth its mighty tongues of fire and streams of melted lava, I was far from the sublime and awful scene, thanking God I was alive to tell the story of my wonderful escape from a burning tomb.

ACCIDENTAL DEATH OF A SOLDIER.

The ball passed into the left temple, penetrating the brain. His remains will be brought to this city, for interment.

From Eastern Kentucky.
LOUISVILLE, Feb. 6.—Col. Garfield is at Paducah with a sufficient force to preserve order. The Virginia and South Carolina regiments under Marshall have gone back to Virginia, and Marshall and the rest of the forces went to Paducah, where he dispatched them. The whereabouts of Marshall is unknown. A rumor prevails that a party of rebel cavalry, supposed to be of Morgan's force, were surprised last night between Lebanon and Green river, and forty of them killed. No Federal loss.

Affairs in Missouri.
ROLLA, Feb. 6.—A correspondent of the Missouri Republican says the remainder of Gen. Belknap's division started West on Sunday last, and without incident, including Brigadier General Cook, Asst. Brigadier General Cook, and others. The division started several days ago, and there are now left at this place only the troops who are to remain for the protection of the post.

Disloyal Pensioners.
WASHINGTON, Feb. 6.—The President has approved the bill authorizing the Secretary of the Interior to strike from the Pension Rolls the names of all such persons as have or may hereafter take up arms against the Government of the United States, or who have in any manner encouraged the rebels or manifested a sympathy with their cause. It is known that some persons in the West, after having taken the pension, have since joined the enemy, while others who have not taken this extreme step have openly sympathized with the rebels, and have been drawing their pension. The law just passed affords a partial remedy against disloyal Pensioners receiving money from the Government.

Gordon, the Slave Trader.
NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—The President has granted a respite of two weeks to Gordon, the slave trader, who was to have been hanged to-morrow.
