FURTHER PARTICULARS FROM FORT DONELSON.
AN ACCOUNT OF THE BATTLE.
Terrible Slaughter in our Ranks!!!
A BLOODY BATTLE!!
THE KILLED AND WOUNDED.
EXCITING DETAILS.

CHICAGO, February 18.—The following is an account of Saturday's fighting at Fort Donelson.
On Saturday morning the battle was renewed. The rebels were again driven back, and the fort was again in our hands. The fighting was very hard, and many brave men were killed and wounded.

FOR THREE HOURS the rebels, numbering nearly three thousand men, held their ground against the whole force of our army. At one time the rebels were driven back to the river, and our men were within a few rods of the fort.

THE KILLED AND WOUNDED.
The killed and wounded in our ranks were as follows: Killed, 1,200; Wounded, 1,500. The rebels lost 2,000 men, including 1,000 killed and 1,000 wounded.
