Tennessee Rolling Mills Burned--Mail Bags Captured--scare of Floyd's Brigade.

FORT DONELSON, February 18 .- The great fire which was seen up the river last night was occasioned by the burning of the Tennessee Rolling Mills. Four milis were destroyed by our gunboats. The works had been used by the rebels for the manufacture of shot, shell and other material of war. It was an extensive concern.

General Grant has promulgated a most stringent order against plundering from the inhabitants. Also, one against stealing the property taken in battle.
