**Weights and Measures of Various Farm Products, and other Things in Various Countries.**

**Heaping Measures.**  
Potatoes, turnips and sweet roots, apples and other fruits, meal, bran and in some States oats, are sold by heaping measure, which contains 2,815 cubic inches.

**Barrel Measure.**  
Rice, 800 lbs. four; 100 lb. powder, 25 lbs. cider and other liquids, 30 gallons; corn, 5 bushels, etc.

**Ton Weight and Ton Measure.**  
A ton of hay, or any coarse, bulky article usually sold by that measure, is equal to 2,240 pounds.

**Compute Weight of Cattle by Measure.**  
Ascertain the girth back of the shoulders, and the length along the back from the square of the buttock to the point of the point of the hip.

**To Measure Corn in the Ear.**  
Find the cubic inches as above, and divide by 2,815, the number of inches in a heaped bushel, and take two-thirds of the quotient for the number of bushels.

**Government Land Measure.**  
A township is six miles square, and contains 36 sections, 25,000 acres. A section, one mile square, 640 acres.
