this precipitous face I turned westward and encountered a steep slope of snow, which apparently led up to within a few hundred feet of the jokler-bedecked summit. Here I would fain have got rid of my barometer and geological case, which were sadly in my way; but, without the first, I had no means of ascertaining the height of the mountain, should I reach its summit, and I was very reluctant to abandon my specimens. On emerging from this chasm, the rock I had next to climb was very steep, and worn smooth and polished by the action of a small summer stream that trickled on it, presenting no holding-place at all. The lower part seemed a trifle rougher than the rest, and over this I essayed to ascend, the way becoming steeper and smoother as I crawled along, till at last I was obliged to rest by the whole surface of my body.
