The late war operations in America have led to considerable discussion in Prussian military circles, and the system apparently adopted by General McClellan is compared to that of the Allies in 1813, when they attacked Napoleon with three armies from the North, the South, and the East. By following this plan, however, they exposed themselves to be beaten in detail, as they were in effect at Dresden, a defeat which, but for the blunder committed by Vandamme, would have utterly ruined their cause. Their final success was partly owing to this fortunate accident, partly to the dishing generalship of Blucher, and, above all, to their numerical superiority, the Austrians, Russians and Prussians outnumbering the French in the proportions of two to one.
