WINCHESTER, Va., June 5, 1862.

Escape of Philadelphians. Six members of the 110th Pennsylvania, all of whom are residents of Philadelphia, contrived to effect their escape from Jackson during his retreat. I was only able to get the names of four of them: Charles Wilson, residing on Fifth near Fitzwater street, Henry O'Neil, Jno. Dunn and Wm. Stevenson. They hid themselves in an old building at Strasburg, and as soon as the last of the rebels passed they came out and made good time for this point. Wilson was taken by Ashby's cavalry, and the troopers of that somewhat mythical cavaltroopers of that somewhat mythical caval-ry leader were only prevented from shoot-

ing him by the direct intervention of their

Another Gallant Escape. Twenty-five of the prisoners taken during Banks' retreat by the rebels contrived to conceal themselves during the sharp attack made by Fremont's cavalry upon Jackson's rear, at the bridge which crosses the Shenandoah near Mount Jackson, in a hospital. After the Confederates had crossed the river they entered the Union lines, and were ordered by Gan Fremont lines, and were ordered by Gen. Fremont to join their regiments at once. Hence their return to this point. They were most-ly members of the 1st Maryland, Col. Ken-

Colonel Murphy. These escaped prisoners all concur in the statement that the gallant Colonel of the

Twenty-ninth Pennsylvania Volunteers is alive and well, though a prisoner in the hands of the rebels. He is said by them to be in good spirits and bears up under his misfortunes exceedingly well, and hopes to be soon exchanged. There is some hope of his early exchange.

Frement at Mount Jackson. Fremont pressed the rear of Jackson so closely at this place, on Tuesday morning, that Jackson's infantry absolutely fired the bridge across the Shenandosh before Ashby could cross with a portion of his caval 

General Bayard. This officer, a graduate of West Point, and long schooled in the wild cavalry encounters with the Indians of Texas, leads Fremont's advance. Fremont ordered him to swim the river at once. It must have been a grand sight to have seen those two thousand cavalry swimming a swollen and rapid stream like the Shenandoah.

But the crossing was effected with safety, and but little loss, under a heavyfire from the guns of the enemy, and the fierce pursuit again began,

mit again began, Frement's Rapidity. This bridge was burned about seven o'clock in the morning. By ten, Fremont had a pontoon bridge laid, and had commenced to cross his infantry and artillery. Beyond this affair at Mount Jackson, these returned prisoners could give me no accurate account of the doings of either general. 


