Potatoes. A writer in the Springfield Republican says:-" An article in the Republican, last spring, extolling the "Bulkley Seed ling" potatoes, attracted my attention. It was claimed that the yield was large, the flavor fine, and they were not affected by the rot. I obtained a bushel from the Bulkley farm, paying at the rate of \$5 per barrel. When received they were of good size, but a few were rotten. They were planted on sward land, a gravelly wore planted on sward land, a gravelly loam, with a southern exposure. The field was plowed deep, using the double 'Michigan' with two yokes of oxen, and plenty of well rotted manure—which had been composited two years—harrowed in. The balance of the piece was planted with "Colebrook Seedlings," a variety well known in Litchfield county—cost. 50 cents.




