The Internal Revenue Law.

Five copies of three published letters of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, George S. Boutwell, Esq., which we extract the following, which may be regarded as decisions on the points touched, and are intended to take advantage of the opportunity of the stamp is not absolutely necessary until the 1st of January, 1863. All instruments, therefore, made previous to that date, will be valid without stamp.

I consider that a tavern keeper must be licensed as a retail liquor dealer in order to sell liquor. He is expressly permitted to sell cigars by article 15, section 16, and his tavern license enables him to sell grocers food and lodgings. I see no reason for subjecting him to an eating-house license.

I have considered salicamakers as manufacturers. If a person whose occupation is that of a retail dealer occasionally sells in original packages to consumers, he is not thereby required to take a license as a wholesale dealer; but if he sells in original packages or by the piece to those who buy to sell again, he must take license as a wholesale dealer.
