The Reasons. I can state the reasons so far as I have learned them, and I know of no one who has learned any others. Nearly every eneral officer in this army gave it as his pinion, fifteen days ago, that the army was no condition for a movement or a campaign, in consequence of the absence of many necessary supplies, such as clothing, shoes, blankets, shelter tents, etc.—
The old Army of the Potomac, and that of Pope and McDowell, it was said, had, of Pope and McDowell, it was said, had, through their many marchings and fightings, lost nearly all their equipments, and these must now be replaced to prevent suffering. Well, this work has been going on for the past two weeks, though it seems nothing was done about it until the President came up and looked at the men himself. He compelled what Gen. McClellan could not command.

From personal observation. I know that

From personal observation, I know that these supplies were needed to keep the army in first class order—to keep it as well clothed and shod as it usually has peen. But he two weeks or more that it is taking to supply them is the finest and best fighting weather of the year. We are now in the commencement of the rainy season, and we have heavy rains nearly every other day. These narrow mountain roads and defiles, difficult of passage in the best weather, are almost impassable in wet weather; and if our troops move now and have a fight, it will need, as it always does after a battle, a re-issue of supplies to make up for losses. One of the features which strikes an outward observer

very prominently, and militates against predictions of action, is the absence of sc large a proportion of general and field offi-cers. Not all gone, sick and wounded, but away on leaves of absence, until dozens of brigades and one or two divisions are com-manded by colonels, and some brigades by lieutenant-colonels; and in the division of regulars, one brigade is commanded by a captain. I can safely predict that, should a battle occur within the next thirty days, the proportion of officers lost will be vastly reduced, from be present in action in vastly reduced Winter Quarters.
