TO OUR ADVERTISING PATRONS. ENTIRELY VEGETABLE. The undersigned publishers of the city daily press have been compelled, by the depreciation of the currency, the operation of the new tax bill; and the great'y increased cost of everything used in the pr nting art, to take council together, so as to protect themselves from loss, at the smallest expense to their patrons. No class of producers in the community will feel the effects of the revenue taxes so severely and so directly as publishers.— Congress seems to have specially marked them out for the imposition of an unusual number of taxes Had their share been limited to the three per cept. impost on their gross revenue arising from adver nts, they could have cheerfully paid it, and felt they were doing their full share towards equalizing the pecuniary burdenof the war; but, in addition to this, and to those which publisher meet as individuals, they have to pay, also, a tax or paper, on ink, on telegraphic despatches, &c.,

But even this is not all. Owing to the prevalen practice of each manufacturer, or producer of taxable articles, making himself simply the agent fo collecting the Government tax from the consume the impost laid upon every article employed making up a journal is thrown upon the publish ar, and thus he has now to pay a largely increa ed price for his ink, his tyre, his coal, and, more especially, his paper, which is the main item of his expense. Nay, on account of the scarcity of co ton rass paper, has gone up, and is still going up, far beyond what the tax alone would have caused while labor, owing to the enhanced price of every necessary, has advanced in nearly the same rapid ir portion. We thus find that the augmented cost of publishing a paper just now is nearly forty per cent, more than what it was a few weeks sinc In the face of this slarming exhibit, we find a diminished revenue, the chief source of which rev enue to a journalist is advertising. The price of abscription in this country is unreasor so near the cost of the white paper, ink and printing, as to leave the slenderest margin for profit.-The larger circulations thus secured by the cheapness of the paper is depended upon to increase the price and the number of advertisements which are the life-blood of a newspaper. But, un tunately, aivertising is the most sensitive branch of human enterprise. It expands during days of thrift and prosperity, and contracts to the smallest compass during periods of doubt and business or monetary revolutions. Since thewar commenced, advertising has fallen off with us, as with journalists generally throughout the country, from thirty to fifty per cent, and we now find ourselves with a flourishing circulations, it is true, but without the revenue which is invariably based on such wide dissemi-

What are we to do? The public demand for news, in these excited times, must be supplied .-It is manifest that when a paper is sold even the minutest fraction below its cost, the larger its cirenlation the greater the loss it entails. If advermight be covered, but the direct contrary is now the case. We wish to refrain as long as possible from laying a tax upon knowledge by adding to the price of our papers, but we think that, both on account of what has above been urged, and on secount of our incressed circulations. advertisers ought to consent to a slight advance on the rates of advertising, always exceedingly low in our city. of advertising, always exceedingly low in our city.

Even in these solemn hours of approaching death he had no penitence to express in view of his politicial career, for his motives had been exalted, and his measures beneficient in the extreme. With grati-tude and well-founded pride he could well

say:
"I have hallowed the Revolution by infusing into it our laws. My code is the sheet anchor which will save France, and entitle me to the henediction of posterity. The plan of leaving the Alps was the one first formed at the commencement of my career. I had entered Italy, and finding that communications with Paris occupied considerable time, and were attended with much difficulty. I endeavored to render them quicker, and readled to open them through the valley of the Rhone. I also wished to render that river navigable, and blow up the rocks under which it engulphs

and disappears. I had sent engineers on the spot. The expense would have been inconsiderable, and I submitted the plan to the Directory. But we were carried away by events. On my return from ligyot, we applied hammers to the Alps.
