THE REFUSAL OF THE PENNSYLVANIA RESERVES TO REFORM PICKET DUTY.

We believe it is true that the Pennsylvania Reserves when sent on picket duty on Friday last, refused to do so on the ground that they have been in the service since May, 1861, that they have participated in the most hard-fought battles in Virginia, that they are so reduced in number that no one regiment will number 250 men, and that their request to go home and recruit has been disregarded, while the Second New Hampshire Volunteers, have been allowed to go home. Because of this partiality, the officers and men of our reserves refused to do the duty required of them.
