There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

SECTION 4 Whenever any of the qualified electors of the Commonwealth shall be in actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the anthority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the ditter of the commonwealth and elections as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as felly as if they were present at their usual place of election.

There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriate hills.
