There shall be an additional section to the chiral
time division of the Constitution, to be designeded as thereof:
There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:
SECTION 4 Whenever any of the qualified alectors of this Commonwealth shall be in actual military service, under a requisition from the first free free the United States, or by the anthority of this Commonwealth such e ectors may extended the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, sudor such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election.
There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution to be decisanted as ections eight and nine, as follows.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, for privileges, has been, or may becreater be, conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.
