the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof.

There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

Skotton 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the anthority of this Commonwealth, such electors may excepted the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizons, under such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election.

There shall be two additional sections to the elevanth article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

Skotton 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills.

Skotton 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be, conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth,

To agents per hundred Dr. Brownson's Theology. A writer in the German Reformed Mes-

enger over the signature R-, and dating from Mercersburg Theological Seminary, published during the past month some ineresting papers of Dr. O. A. Brownson, and his theological fluctuations. It is melancholy indeed to see the contrast which is so plainly shown in these papers between Brownson's former truly Catholic avowals, and his later dissatisfied and carping tone. The writer himself says, "Every man who has read his Review for the lastfour or five years, must have found reason to suspect, notwithstanding Dr. Brownson's avowal to the contrary, that what he son's avowal to the contrary, that what he wants is a change in the life, the principles of the Catholic Church, in much that Catholics hold as vital." The truth is that, though Dr. Brownson has written ably and well on the Church, we are forced to suspect that he has never fully seized the true and proper conception of this jurily human, partly divine society. He looks, it seems to us, at one time on the purely human, at another on the purely divine side, but he fails to harmonize them, so to bring their quality to unity as to comprehend their mutal, reunity as to comprehend their mutual renoity as to comprehend their mutual re-lations. Thus, formerly looking at the infallible teaching power, and at the grace-giving dispensation instituted of God, wearred and harraesed by long years of doubt and uncertainty, he glady caught at the divine element, extolled it as was but just, and was never weary of deploring the misery of his friends who knew it not, and of inviting them to come to en-joy with him the great boon of Truth and Grace. But gradually the first fervor wore off, his attention was called more to the human element in the Church, and we the human element in the Church, and we who remembers the invincible power given from above to the Spouse of Christ. Thus it has come to pass that in his late writings there is a sad want of that piæ credulitatis affectus, of that filial docility which is the indication and the effect of a truly Catholic spirit. But, especially, we think

find him writing of her much as he would write of any merely human organization, write of any merely numan organization, recommending courses of action av wedly based upon expediency, and magoifying as great evils things, which though evils, need not be feared so much by one Catholic spirit. But, especially, we think he greatly mistakes the nature and extent of Catholic faith. He appears to hold that only that which has been defined to be faith, is really a part of Catholic faith. This is not true: Catholic faith is always the same, and is to be found in the living tradition and practice of the Church; definitions merely promulgate certain points more clearly, and take away all excuse of ignorance from those who do not admitted. If a person knowledge contradiction. them. If a person knowingly contradic, the decrine of the Church as he finds it in her living tradition, in her liturgy, or her practice, he commits a mortal sin against faith, whether there has been a definition, he is a heretic in the technical sense of the word, that is he incurs not contract and word, that is, he incurs not only the guilt of the sin of heresy, but also the censure ulminated against it. But this censure is not incurred unless by an outward mani-festation of the heretical opinion, so that a man who denies in his heart the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, but does not outwardly express his unbelief, does t incur the censure, though he is certain ly guilty of the crime of heresy. The narrowing of Catholic faith to the points defined by the Church is theoretically indefensible, and practically productive of the worst results. Still, as long as he did not exceed the bounds of Catholic liberty, we did not consider that this disapproval was intended officially to consegn the Review, and we consequently tho 11 lit to be our duty to treat it as a Carnolic periodical, though we always expressed our dissent from his un Catholic views.
