There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

Section 10 and the Commonwealth shall be in actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the anthority of this Commonwealth, such elections may oxercise the right or suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as felly as if they were present at their usual piace of election.

There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

Section 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature opniaining more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills.

Section 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any lowers, privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth, Speaker of the House of Representatives
