Important to River Men. The following order, although intended more immediately for the mariners of Louisville, will be read with interest by all river men, as well as citizens generally.

Orders. The following (inserted) orders will be observed by all steamers doing business for Government by river or otherwise, from the port of Louisville.

HEADQUARTERS MILITARY DIVISION OF MISSOURI. The great demand for Pilots having rendered it necessary to employ a sufficient number of pilots to service the river, it is hereby ordered that no steamer shall be allowed to proceed up the river until it is properly manned.

Headquarters Military Division of Missouri. The following orders will be observed by all steamers doing business for Government by river or otherwise, from the port of Louisville.
