



Great Works of Antiquity. The size of the stone forms no part of the wonder of the pyramids. There are many structures in the world containing much larger monoliths, and modern architects frequently use stones larger and heavier than any in the pyramids. The largest courses of stones in Cheops are only four feet ten inches in thickness, and the stones vary in length from

four to eight feet.
