JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO
THE CONSTITUTION. Be it restived by the
Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonsecult of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,
That the following amendments be proposed to
the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article
thereof:
There shall be an additional section to the
third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

"Escrum 4. Whenever any of the qualified
electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any
actual military service, under the requisition
from the President of the United States, or by
the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all
elections by the citizens, under such regulations
again, or shall be, presoribed by law, as fully as
if they were present at their usual piace of election."

ioliows:
"Section 8. Nobilishall be passed by the Leg-islature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except ap-propriation bils." shall be clearly expressed in the true, saddly propriation bills."

"SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, nany case where the authority to grant such plowers, or privileges, has been, or may hereater be conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth."
