There is not even a pretext for the complaint that the disaffected States are to be conquered by the United States f the revolution fail; for the rights of the States, and the condition of every human being in them, will remain sub ject to exactly the same laws and form of administration, whether the revolu-tion shall succeed or whether it shall fail. In the one case the States would be federally connected with the new confederacy; in the other, they would as now, be members of the United States, but their constitution and laws customs, habits, and institutions in either case will remain the same.

It is hardly necessary to add to this acontestable statement the further fact that the new president, as well as the citizens through whose suffrages he has come into the administration, has always repudiated all designs whatever and wherever imputed to him and them of disturbing the system of slavery as it is existing under the Constitution and laws.
