PENNSYLVANIA. Philadelphia, Nov. 8, 12 M.—The vote is as follows: Mayor for Lincoln, 1,397.

Second ward, Lincoln 285; McClellan 241. Republican majority 11, a gain of 25.

Third ward, Lincoln 187; Republican gain of 18. Fourth ward, Lincoln 37; Republican gain of 2.

Fifth ward, Lincoln's majority 24. Sixth ward, Lincoln's majority 62. Shady side of 6.

Republican gain of 93 in the city. Arriving County—Lincoln's majority in Kittanning 65, a gain of 20 on the October election.

Lincoln's majority in Precept 87—a gain of 19. Beaver County—New Brighton 203.

Abolition majority—Abolition gain of 2 over October election. Cambria County—Johnstown, 1st ward, 182 votes polled—Lincoln 124, McClellan 57; Lincoln's majority 67.

Later—Johnstown. Borough entire gives Lincoln 210 majority. Erie, Pa., gives Lincoln 284 majority, a gain of 72.

Returns from a few towns in Pennsylvania give small Shoddy majorities. Philadelphia, all but two wards give 10,390 Republican majority.

Patrol returns from 15 counties in Pennsylvania show a Republican gain of 1,207, full vote given. A private despatch from Philadelphia says Delaware gives Lincoln her electoral vote.

Middletown, Pa.—Lincoln's majority, 51; Abolition gain of 12. Chambersburg, Pa.—Abolition majority 163.

INDIANA. Indianapolis, Nov. 8, 6 P. M.—The election is progressing rapidly here and generally throughout the State. A slight disturbance occurred at Brownstown. Lincoln will have not less than 1,000 more than Morton's majority in this city.

Indianapolis, Nov. 8.—Election returns from all points heard from show large Abolition gains over the October election. Lincoln's majority will be from 30,000 to 35,000. The Ohio soldiers' vote here is: Lincoln, 292; McClellan, 18.

MISSOURI. St. Louis, Nov. 8.—Returns measure. Republicans estimate Lincoln's majority in this county between four and five thousand on home vote. The Democratic gain here from 1,000 to 2,000. John Hogan, (Dem.) is probably elected to Congress in First District over Knox and Johnson, (Rep.) Henry T. Blow, (Rep.), the present representative of the Second District is re-elected.

MAINE. Portland, Me., 9 p. m.—There is a very early rain and the telegraph works badly. There has been no returns received from the eastern towns. We have twenty-eight towns, which give Lincoln 18,264, and McClellan 7,844, a shoddy gain of 380 on the September election. The vote of Portland falls up: Lincoln, 18,264; McClellan, 7,844, a shoddy loss of 6.

WEST VIRGINIA. Wheeling, W. Va., Nov. 8.—Returns from this county show a large shoddy gain over the October election. The Abolitionists will carry the State by large majorities in every county.

NEW YORK.

New York, Nov. 8.—The market is unusually quiet, even for election day, and the streets had deserted in appearance. Transactions in all departments postponed. At the Stock Exchange transactions were limited and prices generally weak and lower.

Gold room having adjourned to Wednesday morning, transactions were quite limited. Fluctuations in prices much less marked than usual, and the high figures at last night's Exchange not fully supported on Street quotations, being during the morning 2,474.48. Loan market active, but there appears less pressure than prevailed yesterday afternoon.

Foreign Exchange sympathizes with the general dullness received in speculations expected to morrow.

The election has passed off quietly, and no lights are reported in any part of the city. The vote of the city is unusually large, and it is reported that Hunsberrly will indicate the result at the hour. The morning and evening papers contain little news, being filled with election.

Rochester, N. Y., Nov. 8.—Rochester gives a Democratic majority of 62—an Abolition gain of 128 over last year. Buffalo, Nov. 8.—No official returns have been received here from New York City, but it is reported that it has gone about 30,000 for McClellan. Albany gives about 2,500 for Little Mac. Buffalo City gives 600 majority for McClellan.

Oswego, N. Y., Nov. 8.—The city and ten towns in the county give 1,702. The remaining towns will probably increase this to 2,500. Three Abolition members to the Assembly elected.

The vote of New York City for Lieut. Governor is as follows: Alford, 36,064; Jones, 73,790. It is reported that Hunsberrly, (Abolition) is elected to Congress from Brooklyn; also, that H. J. Raymond is elected to Congress, and that Fernando Wood has been defeated for Congress by Darling.

New York, Nov. 8.—10 p. m.—The following is the total vote of this city: Lincoln, 38,442; McClellan, 73,229. One ward, the Fifth, gave Lincoln a majority of 274. Total majority for McClellan in the city, 36,613.

Albany, Nov. 8.—McClellan's vote in the city is 7,542; Lincoln's vote, 5,062; majority for McClellan, 2,476. Seymour's majority, 2,463.

Troy gives a majority for McClellan of 728. New York City—Fifty-five towns outside New York city show a majority of 7,000 for Lincoln.

LAYTON—R. Conkling (Rep.) is elected to Congress over Kernan. Raymond, in the 6th district is elected over Humphreys, in Brooklyn; both Shoddy certainly elected. Taylor (Dem.) in the 8th district, and Chandler (Dem.) in the 9th district are elected to Congress.

New York gives 27,747 for Seymour, and 36,192 for McClellan. Returns from 105 towns and 47 counties give Lincoln 20,704 majority in 84 towns and cities, including Albany, Buffalo, Troy, Schenectady and Utica, and two counties McClellan has 1,094 majority.

130 a. m.—Indications are that Maryland, Indiana and Beaver have undoubtedly gone Abolition.

Troy City—McClellan's majority over Lincoln, 788; Seymour over Patton, 802.

The Herald's Fortress Monroe special says that the Tallahassee was fired into by five vessels at the time she ran out of Wilmington. Nine fast vessels are in pursuit of her.

The following is the detailed news by the City of Baltimore: Hong Kong advices of September 10th says that a fleet of eight British ships, mounting 184 guns, three French ships, and five Dutch vessels were nearly ready to sail for Japan.

A merchant steamer had been chartered by the American minister. Richmond papers acknowledge the defeat of General Vaughn, losing four pieces of artillery and two hundred men, and says the attack was a surprise.

The Baptist Association of Georgia calls for a legislative act to protect marriage rights of the State. The Examiner has an article on the scarcity and high price of butter, which sells at two dollars per pound.

The Enquirer has an article on the lack of discipline in the cavalry, and calls for re-organization. The Enquirer has a long letter from the army favoring the conscription of all negroes, and says that the army generally is favorable to the movement, and thinks that the negroes would make good soldiers.

The same paper has a letter from a planter opposing the scheme, and says that sending the negroes would be a death blow to slavery, and points out the danger to the South from negro soldiers after the war has ended.

Washington journals say that the Yankee attack has been postponed for the present.

KENTUCKY. Louisville, Nov. 8.—Nashville gives Lincoln 1,817; McClellan 28. The Ohio soldiers give Lincoln 476; McClellan 101. The Louisville ticket is elected by a large majority. The Louisville election was the most quiet known for years.

The Union Press (Abolition) estimates McClellan's majority in Kentucky at from 15,000 to 20,000. The Journal (Dem.) claims 25,000 for Little Mac. The State has gone for Little Mac by a large majority, but it is impossible to tell how large. The returns being meagre and the remote counties not being heard from, it is almost impossible to form a decided conclusion.

The Chattanooga military situation is unchanged.

New York Gold Market. New York, Nov. 8.—There having been no meeting in the gold room to-day, transactions in gold were limited, and the indications in price were much less than yesterday. The following are the quotations: 247, 248, and the latest 247.

Scattering Returns.

New Haven, Conn., Oct. 8.—Thirty-one towns, including the cities of New Haven, Hartford, Bridgeport, Waterbury, Norwich and New London, give Lincoln 1,159 majority.

Louisville, Nov. 8.—Partial returns from twenty-eight counties in Kentucky, excluding Jefferson, give Lincoln 200 majority. Louisville (official) gives McClellan 4,878; Lincoln 1,840. Palomont gives 695 majority for Lincoln.

Covington gives 601 majority for Lincoln. Paris gives 68 majority for McClellan. Cynthiana gives 126 majority for McClellan.

Maine—28 towns give Lincoln about 6,000. Vermont—84 towns give Lincoln 7,000. Providence, R. I.—930 p. m.—Returns from nearly the whole State show a majority for Lincoln of about 5,000.

Chicago, Nov. 8.—Telegraphic communication with Iowa is interrupted by the storm. Leading Republicans claim that the State has gone for Lincoln by 25,000.

Madison, Wis., Nov. 8.—Scattering returns from the State show an Abolition loss on the vote of last fall, when the Abolition majority was over 16,000. Experienced Republican politicians estimate on the present returns that the State will give ten thousand majority on the home vote, which will be largely increased by the soldiers' vote.

Detroit, Mich., Nov. 8, 10 P. M.—Republicans claim to have carried the State by fifteen thousand majority. The returns are meagre. Detroit City gives about 1,000 Democratic majority.

Winnington, Del., Nov. 8.—Winnington gives 800 majority for Lincoln, a gain of 500.

MASSACHUSETTS. Boston, Mass., Nov. 8.—Voting proceeds quietly. Partial returns from several wards in the city, at noon, foot up Lincoln 1,107; for McClellan, 358. In the 2d and 4th districts, Rice and Hooper, Republicans, are both elected to Congress.

One hundred and seventy-six towns out of 90,000 for Lincoln and 36,613 for McClellan.
