SYMPTOMS OF CATARRH.

The first semantion is usually a feeling of dryness and heat in the nose, and afrequent inclination to sneezing. There is an insbility to breathe freely, as the nose becomes stopped up, sometimes on one side and sometimes on the other. After more or less time it becomes purulent, highly offensive, and assumes an extremely fetid odor. It is usually so profuse as to require, when confined to the nose the frequent application of the head the hose the frequent application of the head to the one time of choking, caused by the presence of the discharge in the unroat. Cwing to the heat in the head, the watery portion of the secretion often evaporates, and assuming a gondition of solidity is deposited upon the membrane of the nose and upper part of the throat, in the shape of crusts or harviened lumps. The accumulation of these incrustations prodders' a feeling of discomfort, and narrows the head; passings so as to embarrans respiration. Therefore, frequent efforts have to be made to remove them, either by forcibily blowing the nose, or by pernistent hawking—a practice as disagreeable to the one affected as it is to those around him. After the removal, that side of the incrustation which adhered to the nucous membrane will sometimes be found bloody, a fact which explains the force required for its dislodgement. During sleep these incrustations accumulate more rapidly, and the feeling is therefore most uncomfortable in the morning; som times all efforts to clear the throat are futile until after breakfast, or something warm is swallowed.
