**FIRE!**—A very destructive fire occurred last evening, about 8 o'clock. The smoke house of Messrs. McCutcheon and Gamble, on Irwin street, one door from the corner of Penn was totally destroyed. It was filled with Pacon, not a particle of which was saved. The house itself was owned by Mr. Henry McCullough. We have not heard the extent of the loss, but in case the property was without insurance, it must be great. Much fear was entertained for the safety of the block of warehouses on Liberty, stretching to Market street, as the furniture was removed from the dwelling houses adjoining on Penn street. But by the indefatigable exertions of our unequalled firemen, no further damage was done than the total destruction of the building in which the fire originated, and the plough manufactory of Mr. Cahoon.

**The Sandwich Islands.**  
From the tone of the English press relative to the seizure of these islands, we are led to suppose that England is afraid to retain them; but she is evidently preparing for a negotiatory seizure in the matter, unless our government acts in the matter. The islands are good. The subtle London Times of 15th says of the seizure: "The view which has been taken of this treaty of cession in this country is not favorable to its confirmation. Although blame can be laid on Admiral Pauslet for his share in the transaction, we understand that the Sandwich Islands are not to be restored to the dominions of the British Crown, but to be restored to the independent authority of the native sovereign." Although these islands are unquestionably superior to all the other groups in the Polynesian archipelago, in size and in population, and as regards the whale fisheries and refreshment of vessels crossing the Northern Pacific, it does not appear that the possession of them would confer upon this country any advantage which is equally attained by the independence of their independence. That independence having been recognized by the United States, and having been pointedly advertised by the representatives of this country upon a recent occasion, it was obviously our duty to respect it.

This is a question which has been placed in the hands of the Sandwich Islands upon the strongest possible foundation—for we presume that no other state will venture to appropriate what England has continued herself bound to restore, after it had been made over to her with the consent of the reigning monarch. An announcement appears in the Parliamentary reports: "Sir R. Peel has stated, in the House of Commons, that the Sandwich Islands had been ceded to the British Crown."

So then they have been ceded to the British Crown, and the Premier announces the fact. The official Journal, in the meantime, would fain gain the matter over and blind-fold the Americans until the British have the islands hard and fast in their clutches.
