**Coroner's Inquest.**  
Yesterday Coroner Chambers held an inquest on the body of a man named Hugh Reaney, who died in a most wretched state of disease and infection in the yard of Smith's Hotel, 5th ward.

The following is the verdict and report of the jury, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, S. S.

In an inquest conducted on the 10th day of July 1943, before me, John Chambers, Coroner of the county, and in the presence of the body of Hugh Reaney, and there lying dead in the yard of Mr. Smith in the 5th ward, upon the oath of George Stewart, Dr. Hallet, W. Matthews, James Robb, W. Gates, Alex. Robb, John Bales, Daniel Pappas, John Stewart, John Hays, Joseph R. McGinnis, and Arthur Terman, good and lawful men of the county aforesaid, who being sworn and charged to inquire on behalf of the Commonwealth, how, when, where and after what manner the said Hugh Reaney came to his death, by exposure and want of care while laboring under the influenza and dropsy, and not otherwise. In witness whereof, as well as the aforesaid attention of my fellow citizens, the jury do hereby certify that I have been at all times a conscientious and impartial juror, and that the verdict and report of the jury is true and correct.

The inquest jury cannot permit this occasion to pass without expressing their decided disapproval of the general conduct of the Overseers of the Poor of the city of Pittsburgh, in reference to distressed strangers, and that in the opinion of this inquest, the Overseers of the Poor of the city should be residents of the city, in order that they may be found when their services are required. The inquest is fully convinced that the Overseers of the Poor are highly renumerable for their conduct in reference to Hugh Reaney, deceased, inasmuch as they had legal notice of the distressed condition of the deceased, at least twenty-four hours before his death, yet they suffered him to perish like a beast in the yard of a public inn.
