Fire—A destructive fire occurred yesterday morning at about 4 o'clock, in Piquette. It originated in a Tavern known as the Kensington Inn, and although the engine hastened to the ground with their usual alacrity, it was the difficulty in preventing water, and the combustible character of the building, that the flames spread rapidly, and ere they could be arrested destroyed a frame building. The property was not insured and belonged to Messrs. John Wallace and John West. The loss sustained by these gentlemen is said to be \$2000.

The Poor.—We are pleased to see that our citizens with unbecoming liberality and humanity, are making arrangements for the comfort and support of the poor, during the present winter. There are many in our city who will, no doubt, stand in need of the aid of the bannock and philanthropic, and it is imperative that we should give them the help and succor in our power. The proposition adopted at the meeting of Tuesday evening, to purchase a farm for the use and maintenance of the poor, is a measure which recommends itself to our economy and to our humanity. It has been demonstrated that they can be supported at less expense than by the present system. Many of those who are compelled to enter the Poor House are aged or feeble persons, and it is a question for serious consideration, whether such a place, even under the best organization, be conducive to the health of its inmates. Were the Overseers and Council to purchase a farm for their use, the lives of many of them would be extended, the labor would be nothing when divided among the number, and their comforts and happiness immeasurably increased.
