LEGAL TENDER What descriptions of money are a legal tender in the United States is a question frequently asked, and one which few are able confidently to answer, for consequently and obstants one which lew are able confidently to answer, for co-gent and obvious reasons, the power "to coin money, regulate the value thereof, and of foreign coin, and to fix the standard of weights and measures," is, by the Constitution of the United States, conferred on Con-gress; and the States are expressly forbidden to "make any thing but gold and ailver coin a tender in payment of debts." By this act our present decimal denominations of gold, silver and copper coins wase introduced; and all the accounts in public offices, and all proceedings in the Courts of the United States, were required to be kept in dollars, dimes, cents and mills, and the gold and allver coins struck at the Mint, were declared to be a lawful tender in all payments whatever. 3. The good coins of Portugal and Brazil, of no less than two carets line, at the rate of ninety four cents and eight tenths of a cent per pennyweight.

4. The gold coins of Spain, Mexico and Columbia of the fineness of twenty carets and three grains and scription seven sixteenths of a grain, at the rate of eighty nine cents and nine-sixteenths of a cent per pennyweight.
