DELAWARE CANAL COMPANY.

THE undersigned Commissioners named in the Act of Assembly passed the 30th day of April, 1844, entitled "An Act to authorize the Governor to incorporate the Delaware Canal Company," hereby give notice, that in pursuance of the provisions of the said act, they will attend at the Mechanics Exchange, in the city of Philadelphia, on MONDAY, the 5th day of August next, at 10 o'clock, A. M., and there commence the sale of the stock of the Delaware Canal Company, on the following terms and conditions, to wit:

1st. The Delaware Division of the Pennsylvania Canal shall be divided into twenty-five thousand shares, of one hundred dollars each.

2d.
