The New Orleans Picayune of the 18th contains la ter intelligence from Mexico. It says:-At about 10 o'clock yesterday forenoon, the Brig aloop of war Rose, Capt. Sturet, arrived in this port from Vera Cruz, and anchored off the Point. She sail ed from Secrificious on the 8th inst. The officers of the Bose reports that the health of Vera Cruz had much improved, the fever having materially abated. Our advices by this arrival are not so full as we could wish, not a letter from our own corresponde coming to hand, and our files being imperfect. Santa Anns, we are gratified to learn, has place. the remains of the brave and ill-fated Gen. Sentmans at the disposition of his friends in the United States .-This is but an act of proper respect to the memory the dead and to the feelings of the living. It appears, after all the quibbling and denials; what we first stated on the subject of the execution of Sentmanat was true; his head was severed from his body and boiled in oil. Santa Anna utterly disavows the act, and the Government has in consequence issued an order requiring the commanding General at Tobasco to report at once what satisfy public opinion and "all that sort of thing."— This order is dated the 18th of July, at Mexico. It appears that both the French and Spanish Minisgainst the summary execution of the subjects of their respective nations at Tobacco. Our files are not so Guard. complete as to give us the whole correspondence, bu we have a letter from the French minister, dated the PITTSBURGH AND WHEELING REGULAR 18th of July, which thrusts aside with scorn, the sub terfuge behind which the Mexican Foreign Secretar ndeavors to defeat the action of his Government the premises. He reasons the point on the general ground of the universal law of nations. He charges that those French subjects in Sentmanat's expedition, who were shot without trial, and therefore contrary to Wednesday and Saturday at 8 o'clock. For freight the law of nations. The responsibility he throws upon the Mexican Government, and awaits instructions from home as to the course to be pursued upon the blood-thirsty slaughter of Tobasco. That the Spanish Minister has been equally spiri-ted in his protest against the same acts, we infer from the sensitiveness with which Ampudia alludes to him in his dispatch. The papers before us allude to the subject only, but the communications between the two overnments are not given. The President shows himself resolutely bent on er forcing the law against the exportation of specie, whethr silver, which shall not have paid the duty imposed by law, and he calls upon his custom house officers to exercise the utmost vigilance in the premi-We cannot learn verbally anything by this arrival ar the progress of the Mexican designs upon Texas, and our papers throw no new light on the subject whatever.
