Beans—Common white 37 1/2 to 40; small white 41 1/2 to 43 from wagon; \$1.25 from store. Potatoes—A few sales and plenty in market at 4 to 6 cts per lb. Feathers—Fair to prime 25 to 28 cts per lb. Fish—Dried apples all at 6 1/2, 6 3/4 and 6 1/2; Peaches at 11 1/2 to 13 per bushel; a sale of 300 bushels in quantities at 11 1/2.
