

The Report of the Warden will exhibit to you a decrease of eighteen in the number of convicts, as compared with 1843, and a highly satisfactory state of subjection to, and acquiescence in, the regulations for the government of the prison. Owing to extensive repairs, necessarily required in the manufacturing de-purtment of the Penitentiary, the balance sheet, herewith transmitted, will not exhibit as large a credit to profit and loss, as in former years, but an amount which must satisfy you of the anxious solicitude and economy practiced in this branch of the public ser-

The interesting Report of the Physician, shows a decrease of sickness during the past year.
