A HINT FOR RE-PUBLISHERS. The January number of the London Art Union conains a specimen of an engraving produced under new and peculiar circumstances of so wonderful a characer that the first announcement of them, several months completion, by which in the time of a week or fort-night, a copy or steel engraving could be produced rom any print, capable of yielding from ten to twenty thousand fac simil impressions undistingu through which they are now receiving supplies DI. the original, and at a cost of shillings where the first process of engraving cost pounds. It was, moreover, stated that a note of the Bank of England could be a second tected, by any scrutiny, from the original. It is so much the fashion to throw out all sorts of chimerical notions of probable inventions, that all this was very SMITHS' TOOLS. There is a new process, also, for the printing of books, in development, called "Aniastatic Printing," by which in twenty minutes a number of the Times newspaper may be prepared for reprinting and be worked off with the rapidity of the steam press. This appears to be nothing else than securing all the benefits of a stereotype plate from a single printed impression in about a quarter of an hour.

Think of this, ye republishers, and pray Heaven to and into the world a new race of Walter Scetts and Bytons, and to renew the powers of the Bulwers, lickens, Marryuts, lest the invention come too late. It is a consolatory circumstance to authors that this invention does not provide for the writing of books, but only for the reprinting of them, though it is to be feared that some sort of process may yet be consumated by which the "impressions" of a man of genius may be Dagurreotyped away before he has time to
