Of course none of those who were exposed to danger had time to escape—and two workmen, one named Burkhart, the other M'Kee, were wounded-Burkhart died shortly after the accident Several other persons were injured, but none danger-

We are assured by a disintensated person, who i well acquainted with the facts, that every precaution had been taken to prevent accident, and that no blame is to be attached to the Superintendent or any one connected with the building of the vessel. We are also informed that provision will be made for the relief of the family of Burkhardt, and for M'Kee, who will be washle to labor for a long time. This is very well, but we fear that the aid afforded will go but a short way in atoning for the immense loss the sufferers have endused. Burkhardt has left a wife and four children .-They have the strongest claims on public sympathy /would seem that almost every accident or mischance falls most heavily on the poor; the daily earnings of poor Burkhardt, had he been spared to his family, would have yielded them but a slender support-bis death leaves them entirely destitute and dependent on charity.
