GREAT FIRE IN MADISON, IA .- A fire broke out in Madison, on Wednesday night last, about midnight, in Smith's store, under the first Presbyterian church, which, with its contents, goods, account books &c., were consumed. The Hardware store, under the church, was also destroyed; the fire then took hold of the three story brick house adjoining the church, spreading up Main Cross street, to the three story ings in the rear of the church to the alley—then up the alley to Mulberry street, destroying the Comb factory, Shannon's tobacco house, and Ford and Mulby's premises-Marsh's coffee house was much damaged; about twenty houses were burned.
