Idiocy in Kentucky .- According to the Frankford Yeoman there are 413 idiots in Kentucky, supported at the public charge. The same paper gives statistics showing how the complaint runs in families. In one county there are six idiots of the same patronymic; -in another, three, and so on-there being, out of a list of 24 counties given, not fewer than two idiots of the same family in each county.
