THE NEWPORT FIRE. An extra from the office of the Newport Rhode Islander, gives the following particulars of the loss of life attending the calamity of Sunday last:— House, and nearly all the baggage was saved. In about two hours after the fire commenced the whole of this splendid edifice was burnt to the ground.

After it was all reduced to cinders an engin was brought to play upon the spot where the loss ife occurred, and the handless, mutilated remains Mr Gardner was discovered and recognized by his watch, speciables and pencil found on them. 


