This invention is intended for use where it is desired to impart a fine, smooth, and glossy surface to the wood; but it is plicable, with advantage, to all kind of carpenter's plane The novelty cousists in placing the cutting chisel, or bit, in front of the wedge, instead of behind, as in common plane also in applying a metallic mouth-piece to the face of the plane, in front of the chisel, which mouth piece serves as the rest for the chisel, and confines the throat of the plane. But the mouth piece is so close to the edge of the bit as t revent the plane from ripping or splintering the wood i least degree. Indeed, we have seen the implement a plied to the planing of wood against the grain, and th

plied to the planing of wood against the grain, and trans versely to the grain, leaving the wood perfectly amouth. So parfect is the operation of this instrument, that it may be ap-plied to the planing of veneers—with antire success—a thing which cannot safely be done by the common plane.
