The novelty consists in placing the cutting chisel, or bit, in ront of the wedge, instead of behind, as in common planes; also in applying a metallic mouth-piece to the face of the plane, is front of the chisel, which mouth piece serves as the est for the chisel, and confines the throat of the plane. But the mouth piece is so close to the edge of the bit as to prevent the plane from ripping or splintering the wood in the least degree.
