There is no intelligent man who does not know that when the Union was formed it consisted of twelve slave States and one free State. That was the original Union. The "slave power" was omnipotent. It made just such a constitution as it desired, and the only provisions contained in the constitution thus made regarding slavery are, I. The clause requiring that fugitives shall be delivered up; and 2. The clause providing that in all enumerations of inhabitants for the purpose of a basis of representation in the House of Rep. entatives the slave population shall coun three fifths of their actual number. North the negroes are counted at their whole the "slave power" required. It demanded nothing more. With these it was contented. Thus much with respect to the Union at its

formation. It has now increased to thirty-one States, of which sixteen are free and fifteen blave. Of the sixteen free States, six are com posed of territory which belonged originally to Virginia, but which she ceded to the general government, annexing a condition that slavery should not exist within it, and one is a part of the Louisiana purchase, over the whole of which davery existed by law. Thus, seven new free States have been erected out of slave territory, while not one slave State has been erected out c free territory. Meanwhile seven of the slave States have abolished slavery of their own volition, and two or three other subsequent slave States would have done so but for the rise and progress of abolitionism Thus much with respect to the Union at the present mement.
