THE HOUSE ON FEBRUARY 1.

A Saturday morning, after a session of eight hours, the Hall of Congress was inaugurated by a disquieting incident on the part of Leonard M. Kott, of South Carolina, and Othello A. Gray, of Pennsylvania. A private letter from an eye-witness to our confidential telegraphic agent of the impertinent and insolent behavior of Kott, who would not allow the delivery of the South and the delivery of the party, with a note to Kott. This same Kott, who has been denounced by those who speak of border offenses in Kansas, has been elected to the position of National Representative, and has been given the opening words from the press of the country in the House of Congress. Speeches on the part of members of Congress are not common. They are delegated to members of peace—they are to settle questions, not to originate them. It is their duty as a party men to be quiet and to wait until they have been called upon by the majority. We should be very glad to see Kott, Mr. Kott. We presume he will attempt to do so. It is a pity that he has been chosen as a member of the House. Nothing short of expulsion should be meted out to him, whether he be a Democrat or Republican. Let examples be made of them. If Congress deserves the respect of the people or the confidence of the country, we shall have to see a representative of the peace, and must be satisfied with Kott's vote for the next two years.

THE STATE OF MISSOURI.

A week or two since an article upon this subject, we urged upon the propriety of keeping the appropriations within the anticipated revenues of the city, and thus keep matters even near square. By the proceedings of Friday evening, it appears that notwithstanding all the efforts of the Finance Committee, the council has resolved to spend this year several thousand dollars which they cannot say where it is to come from. The appropriation is clearly illegal and those who voted for it can be held personally and pecuniarily responsible.

PENNSYLVANIA.

The Pennsylvania and Press of Philadelphia offer material to us as to the result of the recent Democratic Convention in that city. The Pennsylvania says that the resolutions passed unanimously by the Provisional Committee at all. The following are the resolutions, which are not intended to hurt anybody:

Resolved, That this Convention has full confidence in the patriotism and wisdom of President Johnson, and approves not only of his vindictive and the national honor by a bold and energetic enforcement of our authority laws and international treaties, but also of his arrangements in regard to the admission of Kansas into the Union.

Resolved, That the prompt admission of Kansas as a State, with the unrestricted right of self-government and territorial government, and that the Government shall not interfere with the institutions in their own way, is in the best, if not the only, means by which the results in Kansas will come to district and district the country and peace and order be restored to that Territory.

Resolved, That this Convention, in a recognition of the people of Pennsylvania, has the honor to have one member of the House of Representatives, and to express their confidence in William H. Tucker, on the basis of his experience of the highest order, as well as the judicial character of his Constitutional views, and to express their confidence that the advice of our Government will be satisfactory and successfully administered.

Resolved, That the Common Council continues to refuse by a majority of two to permit the Pittsburgh, Fort Wayne and Chicago Road to make a loan on the city of Pittsburgh. The common council follows a non-operative policy against the commercial interests of Pittsburgh, and is felt by the thousands who are employed directly and indirectly upon the Road. Whilst the community nervously await a promised relief to be afforded them by the city, or a few of them, are endeavoring to prevent it. We have not heard one sentence why the track should not be put down, and the train of the Road and West built at his point, nor are we able to conceive why it is to be injured by the arrangement.

Weighing Coal.

We see that a bill to be before the Legislature requiring coal dealers to weigh each cart load of coal at the place of delivery. This is no more than fair and honest, and in this way has been found to work very good effect.

There is just as much reason for making coal dealers weigh their produce, as there is for requiring grocery dealers to sell by weight. In London coal is never sold otherwise than by weight and in order, and it can be done in London it can be done elsewhere. The public interest requires it—it is a great protection to the poor and it is equal and exact justice to all parties—both buyers and sellers.

The City Council in Philadelphia.
