

LOCAL AFFAIRS.

Adjourned meeting of Council.

The City Council met last night for the purpose of taking some definite action on the right of way of the Pittsburgh, Fort Wayne and Chicago Railroad across Penn street.

In Select Council, President of the appropriation ordinance, introduced some weeks since, was received. They stated that they could not find any error in the estimate for the Police and Fire organizations, and recommended that the Council apply the Legislature's power to levy an additional tax, and accept of C. C. Conover's.

The appropriation ordinance, the main feature of which was to increase the Police and Fire organizations, was passed, and the action of Select Council was approved. In Common Council, the same ordinance was passed, and the action of Select Council was approved.

A motion to the effect that the Finance, Police and Fire Committees be requested to take the appropriation into consideration, and devise ways and means to provide for the thorough execution of the Police and Fire departments, was read three times and passed. C. C. Conover.

Two petitions against the increase of dray licenses were received from Common Council; their action was not concurred in, and the petitions were referred to the Finance Committee, C. C. Conover.

In Common Council, Mr. M'Clary in the Chair. The President read some resolutions from a meeting of the citizens of the Fifth Ward, in favor of the railroad, which were read and referred to members of the Fifth Ward.

A resolution was passed appointing a committee from the Select Council and from the Common Council, to wait on the committee from the Baltimore Council, who are in the city, and confer with the members of the City Council, on the subject of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.

On motion, Council adjourned.
