



The Infernal Machine of 1801. The able Paris correspondent of the New York Courier and Enquirer, in commenting on the recent attempt to assassinate Louis Napoleon and the Empress Eugenie in the Rue Lepelletier, has the following:

The similarity between this atrocious attempt and that of the 3 Nivose, 1801, on the life of the Emperor Napoleon the First (then only First Consul, however,) is most striking. The Emperor's presence at the performance of one of Haydn's oratorios at the opera house, then situate in the Rue Richelieu, but since razed because of the assassination there in 1820 of the Duo de Berry, had been announced. He was for some other reason or presentiment disinolined to go, but Madame Bonaparte-his "adorable Jose phine,"-prevailed on him. He entered his car-riage and left the Tuileries at about eight o'clock. The coachman of His Majesty, who was rather more than elevated by copious libations, pro-ceeded on quitting the Place du Carousal by the Bue Nicarge, a narrow street, which no longer

As he entered it at a smart trot, he saw that which had the appearance of a water-carrier's cart, with a barrel on it, rather in his way, suspiciously, as it seemed to him. The fumes of wine at once evaporated, and whipping his horses into a swift gallop, he cleared the obstruction, but had hardly passed it when a terrific explo-sion took place.
