The involuntary bankruptcy applies to cases where the debts exceed two thousand dollars, and the person declared bankrupt is entitled to trial by jury--all transfers of property of any kind, for the purpose of giving any creditor, endorser, or other person any preference of priority over general creditors, to be null and void, and the parties obtaining them to be sued for such amount as assets of the bankruptcy. With regard to banks and other issuers of paper money, they are to come under the head of involuntary banks upts; and in addition to all the lightlities which attach to individuals, they may be declared bankrupt for the non-payment for ten days after demand of any bill, note or other liability-all the expenses of proce diags to be paid by the parties interested, under no pretense to be paid by the United States. These are the governal features of the bill, we believe. It is to go into effect next November, if now passed,

Under all the circ asstances, it is exectly ingly doubtful if it an pass at this session. but the general impression is that some bill of the character indicated will become a 'aw of this Congress. The retroactive clause will have a good deal of opposition, but if it is well guarenteed that may be overcome. A question will also arise as to the power of the general government to interfere with the State corporations; but if this is pressed the banks may force the agitation of the much more serious question, if it should be carried out, the power of the general government to prohibit altogether the issue of money by authority of any of the States.
