To avoid the labor of rubbing the clothes, and the use of the wash-board, the following directions should be followed:

For the washing of eight or ten of a family, take one pound of Soap, cat it into shavings, and dissolve in one gallon of hot water; put the clothes into a tub containing about ten gallons of warm water; peur in the dissolved Soap, and stir thoroughly. Let them soak twenty to thirty minutes, wring out, and rinse in warm water once, cold water twice.
